Farm Bill Meetings to be Held in Wichita

In December 2018, the 2018 Farm Bill was passed. While there are similarities in the bill, there are also some significant differences. The meetings being held around the state will cover new provisions of the program, economic choices to consider when making a decision, and a new decision tool will be presented to help producers make a decision. Discussion will take a look at commodity programs, particularly the economics of the ARC/PLC decision and the OSU-KSU Farm Program Decision Aid. Time will also be allotted for discussion of the SCO and changes in crop insurance.

These programs will be highlighted with speakers: Dr. Mykel Taylor, Dr. Monte Vandeveer, Robin Reid, Dr. Dan O'Brien, as well as extension agents and FSA personnel.
